Adult PICC/Ultrasound Workshop in Atlanta August 22-23, 2024



QUESTION

We have a difference of opinion on our team on significance of vein compressibility when assessing for access prior to PICC/ML insertion. I believe lack of compressibility of the cephalic, basilic or brachial veins are a red flag for thrombosis. If I find this scenario I will assess the opposite upper extremity to see if the vessels are better options (compressible). If the opposite side is not an option (ex/fistula) I will request a formal venous Doppler to rule out a thrombus in the vessel with poor compressibility. My coworkers say I am overthinking it and I should just choose another vessel in the arm with issues with compressibility. What do you think?

ANSWER

The issue of thrombosis, compressibility and appropriateness of PICC placement is a sticky subject. I agree with you in that abnormal compressibility is suspect for thrombosis SVT and is likely better using the other arm. I don't agree with Doppler because it is superficial, not occlusive and not symptomatic. The sticky part comes in because you have been given an order to place a PICC. Your colleagues are right in one regard, when an unhealthy vein is identified, go for a different healthy one. You can call the prescriber and share your concerns, however, they will not feel an SVT is any cause for alarm.

In a perfect world we would not place PICCs in patients with any history or symptoms of thrombosis AND we would have another better option. The reality is, there are few other options. If it were me I would work to find a vein 3x the size of the catheter and use a single lumen if at all possible. Use the smallest catheter in the largest vein (high on the arm). Encourage the patient to exercise and use their arms.


